## **Parking**

The City of Moreton Bay regulates parking or stopping of vehicles on footpaths, bicycle paths, shared paths, dividing strips or nature strips. Please note that vehicles that are parked with two wheels on the footpath/nature strip and two wheels on the road is not considered as a lawful parking practice.

Council is legally obliged to enforce these regulations, and our Proactive School Safety Patrol Program contributes to this enforcement.

During Proactive School Safety Patrols, enforcement of unlawful parking is applied by obtaining photographic evidence and issuing a penalty infringement notice.

Council prefers that vehicle drivers are educated.

Mobile phones and smart watches at school: I ask parents and carers to please remind your children to check their mobile phones and smart watches into the school office before school and pick up from the office after school. This process supports students who require a phone before and after school whilst ensuring that mobile phones / devices are not accessed during school hours. Mobile phone / device contracts are available from the school office if you are yet to access one for your child.

**Prep Playground:** We have noticed a number of children of both prep and older ages playing on the prep playground before and after school. No students are permitted to use this equipment before or after school. We ask that families please support staff to enforce this requirement.

How many numbers can you cross off the Hundreds Chart?

Students from all year levels are once again invited to participate – parents you may need to help our younger students. Using **ONLY** the numbers **3,6** and **9**, and any operation  $(+-x \div, \text{etc})$ , students write an equation where the answer equals any number between 1 and 100.



For example:

 $3 + 6 = 9 \checkmark 9 - 6 = 3 \checkmark 63 + 9 = 72 \checkmark$ 

Write your equation on a slip of paper – with your name and class, and pop it in the Number Hunt box in the office.

Students can enter as many times as they like, just make sure to submit each equation on a separate slip of paper. All correct equations will go in the draw to win a prize.

The Number Hunt Challenge will be open from Monday April 22<sup>nd</sup> until Thursday May 2<sup>nd</sup>, with the winning entries announced during Assembly in Week 3.
